

HALF TERMLY CURRICULUM CONTENT – Key Stage 3 Religious Education

Intent statement:

We are committed to ensuring that all students make excellent progress in RE through experiencing excellent teaching and an engaging curriculum that motivates them to succeed. Where possible, cross-curricular links will be made to help to build connections in their memory, helping students to value equality and tolerance through knowledge of the world around them.

We aim to give students a RE curriculum that inspires them to become confident and independent learners who can understand and use different knowledge and skills to complement them in school and in the wider world. We aim to engage students in real life experiences both inside and outside of school through carefully planned educational visits, and in school visitors to enrich students culturally and to help them create and understand their civic identity. Year 7

For our demographic, we expect that some students will have some broad to specific knowledge of Islam. However, they may not understand the differences between Muslims.

Year 9

Topics	The influence of Greek mythology
Prior knowledge / skills	These are thematic units – in Year 9 we will use the religious theory learned across Years 7 & 8 to fuel exploration of religious themes. Students may have some historical knowledge of Ancient Greece from KS2.

Assessment	Term 3 assessments will take place June 2024. This will encompass all terms.
Personal Development opportunities	Students will explore the works of Socrates & Plato & investigate the impact of ancient thinking on modern society & ethics
