
Dear all

To the Parents of all Year 10 Students

I hope you and your families are keeping safe and well in these exceedingly difficult times. In May I wrote to you all outlining our potential plans to meet the governments expectations of partial return to school for exam classes.

“On 24 May the Prime Minister announced that secondary schools should plan on the basis that from the week commencing 15 June, they can invite year 10 and 12 pupils (years 10 and 11 for alternative provision schools) back into school for some face-to-face support with their teachers, subject to the government’s 5 tests being met. We are asking secondary schools to offer this face-to-face support to supplement the remote education of year 10 and year 12 pupils, which should remain the predominant mode of education during this term for pupils in these year groups.”

The year 12 students have started to return today, with the aim that Year 10 students then come in the following week, Monday 22nd June.



The Year 10 students will be broken up into 4 groups, allowing us to only have a maximum of 25% of the Year group on site at any point. Each group will have a day in school based on “masterclasses” in the core subjects of English, Maths and Science. These will be sessions to embed prior learning, which have worked really well in the run up to GCSEs in previous years. Following this letter, Mrs Neal will be writing to let you know which group your child is in. On Fridays Ms Bastienne will be arranging small practical sessions for Art and Dt. Again parents will get details of who is invited in, for which session, during this week.

This model we have set up, we believe, on top of the on-line teaching is the safest model for getting Year 10s some face to face time back in school. We would expect them;

- To arrive at the Sports Centre entrance, between 9.45 and 10.00. Keyworker, Year 12 and Year 10 students arrive at different times and to different entrances. (Any students arriving late will have to be turned away unfortunately. We will follow up with a phone call.)
- Ensure Social Distancing as they arrive, the areas have been marked out to assist with this
- Wear school shoes, school trousers and a school white shirt – we won't insist on a blazer or tie
- Bring their own water in a water bottle
- Bring a pencil, pen, rubber and ruler but no school bag
- Their own hand sanitiser and tissues

On arrival they will have their temperature taken. If above 37.7 they will be asked to return home and we will follow up with a phone call home. (We do the same with all staff and visitors to the site.)

All areas will be thoroughly cleaned before and after use. Toilets will be available, but discouraged. Once used they will be cleaned immediately after use.

PPE – it is mandatory to wear masks on public transport. It isn't mandatory in school, but is down to personal preference.
