## Intent statement:

Drama is studied throughout KS3, and the curriculum is carefully sequenced to balance opportunities for creativity and practical exploration, as well as time to engage with the academic analysis of theatre. Our curriculum is engaging and ambitious. Each scheme of work is created to give students insight into each practitioner or style, to ensure that our students hold powerful knowledge which can be applied throughout KS4 and KS5 and will mean that students can engage with and appreciate theatre and the performing arts beyond school.

## Year 10

Assessment	The assessment will take place on week 9 and the following topics will be covered, students need to revise 4 weeks in advance. Component 2 – revise lines and rehearse performance. Component 3 – revise notes from the lesson and practise past paper questions.
Personal Development opportunities	Drama club takes place on a Wednesday lunch time and there is also the opportunity to get involved in the Academy production. Extra rehearsals for GCSE performances can take place at lunchtime or after school.
Homework requirements	Homework will be once a week and this may be to design an element linked to the play, research and prepare for a presentation, learn lines, rehearse, revise content.
