Step 5	Excelling 86%-100%	Pupils show extended knowledge and understanding of local, national and international history Pupils select, organise and use relevant information and make appropriate use of historical terminology. Pupils understand most second order concepts with apply them with confidence. When establishing the evidence for a particular enquiry, pupils consider critically issues surrounding the origin, nature and purpose of sources. Pupils understand most second order concepts and begin to apply them with support Pupils evaluate sources to establish relevant evidence for particular enquiries. Pupils begin to explain how and why different interpretations of the past have arisen or been constructed.

Step 3	Securing 36%-60%	Pupils show that they are approaching a secure knowledge and understanding of local, national and international history Pupils select and deploy information and make appropriate use of historical terminology to support their work. Pupils begin to recognise and describe the nature and extent of diversity, change and continuity, and to suggest relationships between causes. Pupils begin to evaluate sources to establish evidence for particular enquiries. Pupils suggest some reasons for different interpretations of the past and they begin to recognise why some events, people and changes might be judged as more historically significant than others.
Step 2	Developing 21%-35%	Pupils show that they are beginning to increase their knowledge and understanding of the past by using dates and terms, be describing some of the main events, people and periods they have studied and by placing them into different periods of time. Pupils begin to recognise some of the similarities and differences between these periods and are beginning to suggest causes and consequences of the main events and changes. Pupils use sources to find answers to questions about the past. Pupils begin to identify some of the different ways in which the past had been represented.
Step 1	Establishin g 0-20%	Pupils show some knowledge and understanding of the past by using common words and phrases about the passing of time, by placing events and objects in order. Pupils can describe some of the topics, events and people they have studied. Pupils observe or handle sources to find answers to questions about the past.
