

Last March we launched our READATHON to coincide with World Book Day.


This year we are running our **READATHON** from November to the end of January.



READATHON promotes reading and encourages our students to read and listen to fiction and nonfiction in a variety of formats.

Reading is one of THE best things your child can do to help themselves progress at school.

Students can access e books and audio titles through their free to use SORA



accounts in term time and holidays as well as borrow titles from our library.



This year for **READATHON** students can record what they read, how long for and rate each title using **Track My Read**.

Please encourage your child to complete their tracker each time they read or listen to anything for fun. They will see different encouraging messages as they report their reading, and they will be contributing to their form's reading target.



Information for parents on Track My Read - Helping children to love reading!

Reading for pleasure - whether reading on their own or sharing a story - is one of the best ways a child can spend their time.

Research shows that:

- Reading each day can help children improve in all their school subjects
- Reading for just 6 minutes a day can reduce stress by 68%
- Children who read for pleasure are more likely to do well at GCSEs

Choosing to read provides all sorts of benefits - it's comforting, relaxing, reduces anxiety, builds empathy and understanding and aids learning... but above all it's fun!

Track My Read is a new tool from national charity, Read for Good, designed to encourage pupils to read regularly and to help schools understand more about what and how pupils want to read.

Each time your child reads or listens to a fiction or non-fiction title they will make a record using our school tracker.

To access the school tracker, use https://trackmyread.org/school/westfield-academy-937107

Log in using the pass code your child received in school.

Record a new book in their Reading Minutes by selecting Log a new read

Answer a few questions after each reading session.

- What did you choose to read? (from a dropdown list including audio book, comic, book etc.)
- What's the title?
- How did you read? (from a dropdown list)
- How long did you read for? (+/- 5 minute intervals)
- How did you feel when you were reading? (a choice of 5 emojis)
- Give your book a star rating
- Record any other comments you want to make about your read would you recommend the title to a friend?
