engagement and successful participation in the Physics & Materials Science Day at Oxford.




## Sixth Form London Zoo trip




I hold this event dear to my heart. I truly believe that students can achieve so much when given the opportunity to and when given our trust, even at the hardest times.

We will be celebrating www.worldbookday.com this year from 7th March with online events, competitions and new books for the library!




Students can choose a book of their own from one of the 2024 World Book Day titles from








## Artwork

Student of the month featured artwork is Leila, 8S. This is an oil pastel mood portrait inspired by Picasso's blue period focusing on using tints and shades to create tone.




## Sixth Form
